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BRAC & ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND

Base Realignment and Closure, or "BRAC," is the process the Department of Defense uses to reorganize its installation infrastructure to more efficiently and effectively support its forces, increase operational readiness, create synergy among missions, and facilitate new ways of doing business. BRAC 2005 impacts 13 installations nation wide and makes APG one of more than 20 BRAC growth communities in the US. By law, all BRAC 2005-impacted missions must be moved and fully operational by September 15, 2011.

Estimated Number of Positions:

8,300 new, direct positions **on Post** (civilian DoD and embedded contractors)
7,500 – 10,000 indirect jobs (contractor tail and spin-off located **off Post**)
28,000 direct, indirect, and induced new positions to the region
60,000 new residents statewide

When will the transfer of jobs occur and when will unfilled job openings become available?

Nearly 6,200 jobs have moved to APG through July 2011; nearly 2,100 jobs are anticipated to follow between now and September 15, 2011 with 1,600-1,700 as vacancies which will need to be filled. Of those vacancies, the Communications & Electronics Command is on schedule to meet its fiscal year hiring goal of more than 785 personnel. Available jobs will be primarily in engineering and science, logistics, procurement and acquisition, budgeting, and business administration sectors. Average salary is \$87,000; many of the jobs will require a security clearance; all will require U.S. citizenship. Sixty-five percent of personnel are anticipated to transfer with the jobs; up from 20 percent as projected following the BRAC 2005 announcement.
